The Board of Supervisors ("Board") for the Silverlake Community Development District ("District") will hold the following public hearings and regular meeting:

The first public hearing is being held pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, to receive public comment and objections on the District's proposed budget ("Proposed Budget") for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2025, and ending September 30, 2026 ("FY 2026"). The second public hearing is being held pursuant to Chapters 190, Florida Statutes, to consider the imposition of operations and maintenance special assessments ("O&M Assessments") upon the lands located within the District to fund the Proposed Budget for FY 2026; to consider the adoption of an assessment roll; and to provide for the levy, collection, and enforcement of O&M Assessments. At the conclusion of the public hearings, the Board will, by resolution, adopt a budget and levy O&M Assessments as finally approved by the Board. A regular Board meeting of the District will also be held where the Board may consider any other District business that may properly come before it.

Description of Assessments

The District imposes O&M Assessments on benefitted property within the District for the purpose of funding the District's general administrative, operations, and maintenance budget. A description of the services to be funded by the O&M Assessments, and the properties to be improved and benefitted from the O&M Assessments, are all set forth in the Proposed Budget, A geographic depiction of the property potentially subject to the proposed O&M Assessments is identified in the map attached hereto. The table below shows the schedule of the proposed O&M Assessments, which are subject to change at the hearing:

NOTE: THE DISTRICT RESERVES ALL RIGHTS TO CHANGE THE LAND USES, NUMBER OF UNITS, EQUIVALENT ASSESSMENT OR RESIDEN-TIAL UNIT ("EAU/ERU") FACTORS, AND O&M ASSESSMENT AMOUNTS AT THE PUBLIC HEARING, WITHOUT FURTHER NOTICE.

The proposed O&M Assessments as stated include collection costs and/or early payment discounts imposed on assessments collected by the Polk County ("County") Tax Collector on the tax bill. Moreover, pursuant to Section 197.3632(4), Florida Statutes, the lien amount shall serve as the "maximum rate" authorized by law for O&M Assessments, such that no public hearing on O&M Assessments shall be held or notice provided in inture years unless the O&M Assessments are proposed to be increased or another criterion within Section 197.3632(4), Florida Statutes, is met. Note, the O&M Assessments do not include debt service assessments previously levied by the District, if any.

For FY 2026, the District intends to have the County Tax Collector collect the O&M Assessments imposed on certain developed property and will directly collect the O&M Assessments on the remaining benefitted property, if any, by sending out a bill no later than November of this year. It is important to pay your O&M AsJuly 4, 11, 2025

sessment because failure to pay will cause a tax certificate to be issued against the property which may result in loss of title or, for direct billed O&M Assessments, may result in a foreclosure action which also may result in a loss of title. The District's decision to collect O&M Assessments on the County tax roll or by direct billing does not preclude the District from later electing to collect those or other assessments in a different manner at a future time.


Additional Provisions

The public hearings and meeting are open to the public and will be conducted in accordance with the provisions of Florida law. The public hearings and meeting may be continued in progress to a date, time certain, and place to be specified on the record at the public hearings or meeting. There may be occasions when staff or board members may participate by speaker telephone.

Any person requiring special accommodations at the public hearings or meeting because of a disability or physical impairment should contact the District Manager's Office at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the public hearings and meeting. If you are hearing or speech impaired, please contact the Florida Relay Service by dialing 7-1-1, or 1-800-955-8771 (TTY) / 1-800-955-8770 (Voice), for aid in contacting the District Manager's Office.

Please note that all affected property owners have the right to appear at the public hearings and meeting and may also file written objections with the District Manager's Office within twenty days of publication of this notice. Each person who decides to appeal any decision made by the Board with respect to any matter considered at the public hearings or meeting is advised that person will need a record of proceedings and that, accordingly, the person may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, including the testimony and evidence upon which such appeal is to be based.

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RESOLUTION 2025-07 [FY 2026 APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION]

THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION OF THE SILVERLAKE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ("DISTRICT") RELATING TO THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS AND ADOPTING THE BUDGET(S) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2025, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2026; AUTHORIZING BUDGET AMENDMENTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2025, and ending September 30, 2026 ("FY 2026"), the District Manager prepared and submitted to the Board of Supervisors ("Board") of the Silverlake Community Development District ("District") prior to June 15, 2025, proposed budget(s) ("Proposed Budget") along with an explanatory and complete financial plan for each fund of the District, pursuant to the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, at least sixty (60) days prior to the adoption of the Proposed Budget, the District filed a copy of the Proposed Budget with the local general-purpose government(s) having jurisdiction over the area included in the District pursuant to the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(b), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Board set a public hearing on the Proposed Budget and caused notice of such public hearing to be given by publication pursuant to Section 190.008(2)(a), *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the District Manager posted the Proposed Budget on the District's website in accordance with Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes, requires that, prior to October 1st of each year, the Board, by passage of the Annual Appropriation Resolution, shall adopt a budget for the ensuing fiscal year and appropriate such sums of money as the Board deems necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during the ensuing fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE SILVERLAKE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. BUDGET

a. The Proposed Budget, attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, as amended by the Board, is hereby adopted in accordance with the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(a), *Florida Statutes* ("**Adopted Budget**"), and incorporated herein by reference; provided, however, that the comparative figures contained in the Adopted Budget may be subsequently revised as deemed necessary by the District Manager to reflect actual revenues and expenditures.

- b. The Adopted Budget, as amended, shall be maintained in the office of the District Manager and at the District's Local Records Office and identified as "The Budget for the Silverlake Community Development District for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 2026."
- c. The Adopted Budget shall be posted by the District Manager on the District's official website in accordance with Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes* and shall remain on the website for at least two (2) years.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATIONS

There is hereby appropriated out of the revenues of the District, for FY 2026, the sum(s) set forth in **Exhibit A** to be raised by the levy of assessments and/or otherwise, which sum is deemed by the Board to be necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during said budget year, to be divided and appropriated as set forth in **Exhibit A**.

SECTION 3. BUDGET AMENDMENTS

Pursuant to Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes*, the District at any time within FY 2026 or within 60 days following the end of the FY 2026 may amend its Adopted Budget for that fiscal year as follows:

- a. A line-item appropriation for expenditures within a fund may be decreased or increased by motion of the Board recorded in the minutes, and approving the expenditure, if the total appropriations of the fund do not increase.
- b. The District Manager or Treasurer may approve an expenditure that would increase or decrease a line-item appropriation for expenditures within a fund if the total appropriations of the fund do not increase and if either (i) the aggregate change in the original appropriation item does not exceed the greater of \$15,000 or 15% of the original appropriation, or (ii) such expenditure is authorized by separate disbursement or spending resolution.
- c. Any other budget amendments shall be adopted by resolution and consistent with Florida law. The District Manager or Treasurer must ensure that any amendments to the budget under this paragraph c. are posted on the District's website in accordance with Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes*, and remain on the website for at least two (2) years.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

The proposed O&M Assessments as stated include collection costs and/or early payment discounts imposed on assessments collected by the Polk County ("County") Tax Collector on the tax bill. Moreover, pursuant to Section 197.3632(4), Florida Statutes, the lien amount shall serve as the "maximum rate" authorized by law for O&M Assessments, such that no public hearing on O&M Assessments shall be held or notice provided in future years unless the O&M Assessments are proposed to be increased or another criterion within Section 197.3632(4), Florida Statutes, is met. Note, the O&M Assessments do not include debt service assessments previously levied by the District, if any.



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RESOLUTION 2025-08 [FY 2026 ASSESSMENT RESOLUTION]

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE SILVERLAKE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT PROVIDING FOR FUNDING FOR THE FY 2026 ADOPTED BUDGET(S); PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION AND ENFORCEMENT OF SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO PENALTIES AND INTEREST THEREON; CERTIFYING AN ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING FOR AMENDMENTS TO THE ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Silverlake Community Development District ("District") is a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, for the purpose of providing, operating and maintaining infrastructure improvements, facilities and services to the lands within the District, located in the City of Lake Alfred, Polk County, Florida ("County"); and

WHEREAS, the District has constructed or acquired various infrastructure improvements and provides certain services in accordance with the District's adopted capital improvement plan and Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2025, and ending September 30, 2026 ("FY 2026"), the Board of Supervisors ("Board") of the District has determined to undertake various operations and maintenance and other activities described in the District's budget ("Adopted Budget"), attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*, the District may fund the Adopted Budget through the levy and imposition of special assessments on benefitted lands within the District and, regardless of the imposition method utilized by the District, under Florida law the District may collect such assessments by direct bill, tax roll, or in accordance with other collection measures provided by law; and

WHEREAS, in order to fund the District's Adopted Budget, the District's Board now desires to adopt this Resolution setting forth the means by which the District intends to fund its Adopted Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE SILVERLAKE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

- 1. **FUNDING.** The District's Board hereby authorizes the funding mechanisms for the Adopted Budget as provided further herein and as indicated in the Adopted Budget attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and the assessment roll attached hereto as **Exhibit B** ("Assessment Roll").
 - 2. OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE ASSESSMENTS.

- a. Benefit Findings. The provision of the services, facilities, and operations as described in Exhibit A confers a special and peculiar benefit to the lands within the District, which benefit exceeds or equals the cost of the assessments. The allocation of the assessments to the specially benefitted lands is shown in Exhibit A and Exhibit B and is hereby found to be fair and reasonable.
- b. O&M Assessment Imposition. Pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, a special assessment for operations and maintenance ("O&M Assessment(s)") is hereby levied and imposed on benefitted lands within the District and in accordance with Exhibit A and Exhibit B. The lien of the O&M Assessments imposed and levied by this Resolution shall be effective upon passage of this Resolution.
- **c. Maximum Rate.** Pursuant to Section 197.3632(4), *Florida Statutes*, the lien amount shall serve as the "maximum rate" authorized by law for operation and maintenance assessments.
- 3. DEBT SERVICE SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS. The District's Board hereby certifies for collection the FY 2026 installment of the District's previously levied debt service special assessments ("Debt Assessments," and together with the O&M Assessments, the "Assessments") in accordance with this Resolution and as further set forth in Exhibit A and Exhibit B, and hereby directs District staff to affect the collection of the same.
- 4. **COLLECTION AND ENFORCEMENT; PENALTIES; INTEREST.** Pursuant to Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*, the District is authorized to collect and enforce the Assessments as set forth below.
 - a. Tax Roll Assessments. To the extent indicated in Exhibit A and Exhibit B, those certain O&M Assessments (if any) and/or Debt Assessments (if any) imposed on the "Tax Roll Property" identified in Exhibit B shall be collected by the County Tax Collector at the same time and in the same manner as County property taxes in accordance with Chapter 197, Florida Statutes ("Uniform Method"). That portion of the Assessment Roll which includes the Tax Roll Property is hereby certified to the County Tax Collector and shall be collected by the County Tax Collector in the same manner and time as County property taxes. The District's Board finds and determines that such collection method is an efficient method of collection for the Tax Roll Property.
 - **b. Direct Bill Assessments.** To the extent indicated in **Exhibit A** and **Exhibit B**, those certain O&M Assessments (if any) and/or Debt Assessments (if any)

imposed on "Direct Collect Property" identified in Exhibit B shall be collected directly by the District in accordance with Florida law, as set forth in Exhibit A and Exhibit B. The District's Board finds and determines that such collection method is an efficient method of collection for the Direct Collect Property.

- i. Due Date (O&M Assessments). O&M Assessments directly collected by the District shall be due and payable in full on December 1, 2025; provided, however, that, to the extent permitted by law, the O&M Assessments due may be paid in several partial, deferred payments and according to the following schedule: 50% due no later than December 1, 2025, 25% due no later than February 1, 2026 and 25% due no later than May 1, 2026.
- by the District shall be due and payable in full on **December 1**, **2025**; provided, however, that, to the extent permitted by law, the Debt Assessments due may be paid in several partial, deferred payments and according to the following schedule: 50% due no later than December 1, 2025, 25% due no later than February 1, 2026 and 25% due no later than May 1, 2026.
- iii. In the event that an Assessment payment is not made in accordance with the schedule(s) stated above, the whole of such Assessment, including any remaining partial, deferred payments for the Fiscal Year: shall immediately become due and payable; shall accrue interest, penalties in the amount of one percent (1%) per month, and all costs of collection and enforcement; and shall either be enforced pursuant to a foreclosure action, or, at the District's sole discretion, collected pursuant to the Uniform Method on a future tax bill, which amount may include penalties, interest, and costs of collection and enforcement. Any prejudgment interest on delinquent Assessments shall accrue at the rate of any bonds secured by the Assessments, or at the statutory prejudgment interest rate, as applicable. In the event an Assessment subject to direct collection by the District shall be delinquent, the District Manager and District Counsel, without further authorization by the Board, may initiate foreclosure proceedings pursuant to Chapter 170, Florida Statutes, or other applicable law to collect and enforce the whole Assessment, as set forth herein.
- c. **Future Collection Methods.** The District's decision to collect Assessments by any particular method e.g., on the tax roll or by direct bill does not

mean that such method will be used to collect special assessments in future years, and the District reserves the right in its sole discretion to select collection methods in any given year, regardless of past practices.

- 5. **ASSESSMENT ROLL; AMENDMENTS.** The Assessment Roll, attached hereto as **Exhibit B,** is hereby certified for collection. The Assessment Roll shall be collected pursuant to the collection methods provided above. The proceeds therefrom shall be paid to the District. The District Manager shall keep apprised of all updates made to the County property roll by the Property Appraiser after the date of this Resolution and shall amend the Assessment Roll in accordance with any such updates, for such time as authorized by Florida law, to the County property roll.
- 6. **SEVERABILITY.** The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this Resolution shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this Resolution, or any part thereof.
- 7. **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Resolution shall take effect upon the passage and adoption of this Resolution by the Board.

WHEREAS, to provide for efficient and effective District operations and to maintain compliance with Florida law, the Board of Supervisors finds that it is in the best interests of the District to adopt by resolution the *Rules Relating to Parking and Parking Enforcement*, attached hereto as **Exhibit A** for immediate use and application ("Rules"); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE SILVERLAKE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

- **SECTION 1.** The attached Rules are hereby adopted pursuant to this resolution as necessary for the conduct of District business. These Rules shall stay in full force and effect until such time as the Board of Supervisors may amend these Rules in accordance with Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*.
- **SECTION 2.** If any provision of this resolution is held to be illegal or invalid, the other provisions shall remain in full force and effect.
- **SECTION 3.** This resolution shall become effective upon its passage and shall remain in effect unless rescinded or repealed.

EXHIBIT A

SILVERLAKE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT Rules Relating to Parking and Parking Enforcement

In accordance with Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, and on August 4, 2025, at a duly noticed public meeting, and after a public hearing, the Board of Supervisors of the Silverlake Community Development District ("District") adopted the following rule relating to parking on District property ("Rule"). This Rule repeals and supersedes all prior rules and/or policies governing the same subject matter.

- (1) <u>Introduction</u>: The District finds that vehicles and vessels (collectively referred to herein as "Vehicles") parked in violation of this Rule can cause hazards and danger to the health, safety and welfare of District residents and the public. This Rule authorizes parking in designated areas as set forth herein. Further, this Rule authorizes the towing/removal of unauthorized Vehicles parked on District property in violation of this Rule as set forth herein.
- (2) <u>Designated Parking Areas</u>: Vehicles may be parked on District property only as set forth below:
 - a. **ROADWAYS**. Please refer to Chapter 316, *Florida Statutes*, Polk County Code of Ordinances and City of Lake Alfred Code of Ordinances, for laws related to authorized and unauthorized parking of Vehicles on County and City roadways. The District does not own any of the roadways within its boundaries.
 - b. AMENITY PARKING LOT. The District's adopted Amenity Operating Rules are incorporated herein by this reference. Capitalized terms not defined herein shall have the meaning provided in the Amenity Operating Rules. Vehicle parking is permitted for Patrons and Guests only during posted hours. The Amenity Manager or District Board may modify the posted hours for any reason and at any time provided that such hours must be posted at the entrance(s) to the amenity parking lot in accordance with Florida law and also must be posted on the District's website for at least 24 hours before enforcement. ABSENT AN APPLICABLE EXCEPTION AS SET FORTH HEREIN, THERE IS NO PARKING IN THE AMENITY PARKING LOT EXCEPT WITHIN THE POSTED HOURS:
 - c. **OTHER DISTRICT OWNED PROPERTY**. Parking is permitted for District Staff, employees and vendors/consultants only, in relation to active projects or construction/maintenance-related activities. No other parking by anyone is permitted in these areas at any time.

(3) Establishment of Tow-Away Zone.

a. **DISTRICT TOW-AWAY ZONES**. All District owned property in which parking is prohibited as set forth in Section (2) herein, either entirely or during specific hours, is hereby declared a Tow-Away Zone. Tow-Away Zones include all District

owned property which are generally identified on Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. To the extent that parking on District property is only prohibited during specific hours, that portion of District property shall only be considered a Tow-Away Zone during the period of time in which such parking is prohibited. Exhibit A may be substituted with a clearer map without the need for another public hearing provided that the Tow Away Zones are not expanded.

b. **ROADWAYS**. In the event that Patrons or Guests are parked on roadways in contravention of state law and/or local ordinances, Polk County and/or the City of Lake Alfred, as applicable, should be contacted to enforce such parking regulations. The District hereby authorizes law enforcement personnel of Polk County and the City of Lake Alfred and other units of government to enforce the provisions of this Rule, and to enforce any and all traffic and parking laws on rights-of-way located within the District. To the extent necessary, the District may enter into traffic enforcement or other agreements in order to effect the provisions of this Rule.

(4) **Exceptions.**

- a. **DISTRICT STAFF/EMPLOYEES.** District staff and employees may park Vehicles without charge in the Amenity Parking Lot after the hours set forth in Section (2) in order to facilitate District business.
- b. **VENDORS/CONTRACTORS**. The District Manager or Amenity Manager or the designee of either may authorize vendors/consultants in writing to park company Vehicles without charge and in order to facilitate District business. All Vehicles so authorized must be identified by a vendor window pass or have company Vehicle signage clearly visible in a manner determined by the District Manager or Amenity Manager in their sole discretion.

(5) Towing/Removal Procedures.

- a. **SIGNAGE AND LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS**. Notice of the Tow-Away Zones shall be approved by the District's Board and shall be posted on District property in the manner set forth in section 715.07, *Florida Statutes*. Such signage is to be placed in conspicuous locations in the areas identified in Section (3) herein, and shall identify the hours in which the area is designated as a Tow-Away Zone, if applicable, in accordance with section 715.07, *Florida Statutes*.
- b. **TOWING AND REMOVAL AUTHORITY**. To effect towing/removal of a Vehicle, the District Manager or his/her designee must verify that the subject Vehicle was not authorized to park under this Rule during the period in question, and then must contact a firm authorized by Florida law to tow/remove Vehicles for the removal of such unauthorized Vehicle at the owner's expense. The Vehicle shall be towed/removed by the firm in accordance with Florida law, specifically the provisions set forth in section 715.07, *Florida Statutes*.
- c. **AGREEMENT WITH AUTHORIZED TOWING SERVICE**. The District's Board is hereby authorized to enter into and maintain an agreement with a firm authorized by Florida law to tow/remove unauthorized Vehicles from the District's

Tow-Away Zones in accordance with Florida law and with the policies set forth herein.

- Other District Penalties. If any person is found to have violated any of the provisions of this rule, and pursuant to Sections 120.69(2) and (7), Florida Statutes and other applicable law, the District shall have the right to impose a fine of up to the amount of \$1,000 and collect such fine and attorney's fees as a contractual lien or as otherwise provided by Florida law. Fines shall be imposed as follows: (i) the first violation will incur a fine of \$100, (ii) a second violation will incur a fine of \$500, and (iii) any additional violations will incur a fine of \$1,000 per violation. The District Manager shall have the authority to enforce and collect the fines as set forth above.
- (7) <u>Parking at Your Own Risk</u>. The District assumes no liability for any theft, vandalism and/or damage that might occur to personal property and/or Vehicles parked on District property.
- (8) <u>Sovereign Immunity</u>. Nothing herein shall constitute or be construed as a waiver of the District's limitation on liability contained in Section 768.28, *Florida Statutes*, or applicable statutes or law.



FIELD OPERATIONS AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made, and entered into effective July 1, 2025, by and between:

SILVERLAKE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*, and with a mailing address of c/o 2300 Glades Road, Suite 410W, Boca Raton, Florida 33431 ("**District**"), and

HOME ENCOUNTER HECM, LLC, a Florida limited liability company, d/b/a HomeRiver Group and Folio Association Management, whose address is 12906 Tampa Oaks Blvd, Suite 100, Temple Terrace, Florida 33617 (the "**Contractor**").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the District is a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes* ("Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the District is authorized to finance, fund, plan, establish, acquire, construct or reconstruct, enlarge and extend, equip, operate, and maintain systems, facilities and infrastructure in conjunction with the development of lands within the District; and

WHEREAS, the District presently owns and is continuing to construct and/or acquire various systems, facilities and infrastructure ("**Improvements**") located within the District; and

WHEREAS, the District operates and maintains the Improvements and desires to retain an independent contractor to provide for field operations management for the Improvements; and

WHEREAS, for ease of administration, potential cost savings to property owners and residents, and the benefits of on-site inspection, operation and maintenance personnel, the District desires to contract with the Contractor to manage the operation and maintenance of the Improvements.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the recitals, agreements, and mutual covenants contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the parties, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Recitals.** The recitals so stated are true and correct and by this reference are incorporated into and form a material part of this Agreement.

2. Contractor's Obligation.

A. Field Operations Management. The Contractor shall provide the District with field operations management services for the Improvements and shall designate a representative for purposes of reporting to and coordinating with the District ("Contractor's Representative"). The Contractor's Representative shall initially be George Baez, and Contractor shall notify the District in writing of any change in the Contractor's Representative. Contractor shall be responsible for, and authorized to perform on behalf

- of the District, general oversight and management of the Improvements, as further described in the "Scope of Services and Responsibilities" attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.
- **B.** *Inspection.* The Contractor shall conduct periodic inspections of all Improvements. In the event the Contractor discovers any irregularities of, or needs of repair to, the Improvements, the Contractor shall report same to the District Contractor or its designated representative and shall promptly correct, or cause to be corrected, any such irregularities or repairs.
- **C.** Notification of Emergency Repairs. The Contractor shall immediately notify the District Engineer and District Contractor, or a designated representative, concerning the need for emergency repairs of which Contractor is aware when such repairs are necessary for the preservation and safety of persons and/or property.
- **D.** Care of the Property. The Contractor shall use commercially reasonable efforts to protect the District's property and the property of landowners or other entities from damage by the Contractor, its employees or contractors. The Contractor agrees to promptly repair any damage to such property resulting from the Contractor's activities and work and to notify the District of the occurrence of such damage caused by the Contractor's activities within forty-eight (48) hours.
- **E.** *Limitations on Contractor's Duties.* Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary:
 - i. The Contractor shall not be responsible for or have control of accounting or cash disbursements for the District, nor shall the Contractor have the authority to approve change orders or additional services. Any proposals for change orders or additional services must be submitted to the District Manager for consideration by the District's Board of Supervisors.
 - ii. The Contractor shall not be required to make exhaustive or continuous on-site inspections to check the District's property, review construction means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures for work performed by contractors, review copies of requisitions received from subcontractors and material suppliers and other data requested by the District to ascertain how or for what purpose a contractor has used money previously paid.
- 3. **Compensation.** The District shall pay the Contractor \$500 per month for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2025 (July, August and September of 2025) and \$1,200 per month thereafter for the provision of field operations management services pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

4. Term; Termination.

A. The term of this Agreement shall commence as of the date first written above and shall terminate September 30, 2026, unless otherwise terminated in accordance with this Agreement. Thereafter, this Agreement shall be automatically renewed for additional one (1) year periods unless either party provides at least thirty (30) days' written notice of its intent to not renew the Agreement.

- **B.** Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Contractor and the District shall both have the right to terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days' written notice with or without cause. In the event of any termination, the Contractor and the District shall use commercially reasonable efforts to cooperate with one another to provide a smooth and orderly transition of responsibilities between the parties. Any termination of this Agreement shall not release District from its obligation to pay Contractor the compensation and Reimbursable Expenses due for work performed prior to termination, subject to any offsets the District may have.
- 5. **Insurance.** The Contractor shall maintain, at its own expense throughout the term of this Agreement, insurance coverage from a reputable insurance carrier, licensed to conduct business in the State of Florida. The Contractor shall provide the District a copy of the insurance policy, and any endorsements, prior to the commencement of the services contemplated under this Agreement. District shall also receive thirty (30) days' notice of cancellation of any such insurance policy. Policies shall have the minimum levels of insurance as set forth in **Exhibit B.** As may be available, all policies shall name the District, and its staff and supervisors, as additional insureds.
- 6. Indemnity. Contractor agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the District and its officers, agents, employees, successors, assigns, members, affiliates, or representatives from any and all liability, claims, actions, suits, liens, demands, costs, interest, expenses, damages, penalties, fines, judgments against the District, or loss or damage, whether monetary or otherwise, arising out of, wholly or in part by, or in connection with the services to be performed by Contractor, its subcontractors, its employees and agents in connection with this Agreement, including litigation, mediation, arbitration, appellate, or settlement proceedings with respect thereto. Additionally, nothing in this Agreement requires Contractor to indemnify the District for the District's percentage of fault if the District is adjudged to be more than 50% at fault for any claims against the District and Contractor as jointly liable parties; however, Contractor shall indemnify the District for any and all percentage of fault attributable to Contractor for claims against the District, regardless whether the District is adjudged to be more or less than 50% at fault. Contractor further agrees that nothing herein shall constitute or be construed as a waiver of the District's limitations on liability contained in section 768.28, Florida Statutes, or other statute. Obligations under this section shall include the payment of all settlements, judgments, damages, liquidated damages, penalties, forfeitures, back pay awards, court costs, arbitration and/or mediation costs, litigation expenses, attorneys' fees, paralegal fees (incurred in court, out of court, on appeal, or in bankruptcy proceedings), any interest, expenses, damages, penalties, fines, or judgments against the District. The indemnity obligations in this Agreement shall survive expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement.
- 7. **Recovery of Costs and Fees.** In the event either the District or the Contractor are required to enforce this Agreement or any provision hereof by court proceedings or otherwise then, if prevailing, the District or the Contractor, as applicable, shall be entitled to recover from the other all fees and costs incurred, including but not limited to reasonable attorneys' fees, paralegal fees and expert witness fees and costs incurred prior to or during any litigation or other dispute resolution and including fees incurred in appellate proceedings.
- 8. **Limitations on Governmental Liability.** Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed as a waiver of immunity or limits of liability of the District beyond any statutory limited waiver of immunity or limits of liability which may have been adopted by the Florida Legislature in Section 768.28, *Florida*

Statutes, or other statute, and nothing in this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of any third party for the purpose of allowing any claim which would otherwise be barred under the Doctrine of Sovereign Immunity or by operation of law.

- 9. **Assignment.** Neither Party may assign this Agreement without the prior written approval of the other.
- 10. **Independent Contractor Status.** In all matters relating to this Agreement, the Contractor shall be acting as an independent contractor. Neither the Contractor nor employees of the Contractor, if there are any, are employees of the District under the meaning or application of any Federal or State Unemployment or Insurance Laws or Old Age Laws or otherwise. The Contractor agrees to assume all liabilities or obligations imposed by any one or more of such laws with respect to employees of the Contractor, if there are any, in the performance of this Agreement. The Contractor shall not have any authority to assume or create any obligation, express or implied, on behalf of the District and the Contractor shall have no authority to represent the District as an agent, employee, or in any other capacity, unless otherwise set forth in this Agreement.
- 11. **Headings for Convenience Only.** The descriptive headings in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall neither control nor affect the meaning or construction of any of the provisions of this Agreement.
- 12. **Agreement.** This instrument shall constitute the final and complete expression of this Agreement between the District and the Contractor relating to the subject matter of this Agreement.
- 13. **Amendments.** Amendments to and waivers of the provisions contained in this Agreement may be made only by an instrument in writing which is executed by both the District and the Contractor.
- 14. **Authorization.** The execution of this Agreement has been duly authorized by the appropriate body or official of the District and the Contractor, both the District and the Contractor have complied with all the requirements of law in order to effectuate the terms of this Agreement, and both the District and the Contractor have full power and authority to comply with the terms and provisions of this instrument.
- ("Notices.") shall be in writing and shall be delivered, mailed by First Class Mail, postage prepaid, or overnight delivery service, to the parties, and at the addresses first listed above. Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, any Notice shall be deemed received only upon actual delivery at the address set forth above. Notices delivered after 5:00 p.m. (at the place of delivery) or on a non-business day, shall be deemed received on the next business day. If any time for giving Notice contained in this Agreement would otherwise expire on a non-business day, the Notice period shall be extended to the next succeeding business day. Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays recognized by the United States government shall not be regarded as business days. Counsel for the District and counsel for the Contractor may deliver Notice on behalf of the District and the Contractor. Any party or other person to whom Notices are to be sent or copied may notify the other parties and addressees of any change in name or address to which Notices shall be sent by providing the same on five (5) days' written notice to the parties and addressees set forth herein.

- 16. **Third-Party Beneficiaries.** This Agreement is solely for the benefit of the District and the Contractor and no right or cause of action shall accrue upon or by reason, to or for the benefit of any third party not a formal party to this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement expressed or implied is intended or shall be construed to confer upon any person or corporation other than the District and the Contractor any right, remedy, or claim under or by reason of this Agreement or any of the provisions or conditions of this Agreement; and all of the provisions, representations, covenants, and conditions contained in this Agreement shall inure to the sole benefit of and shall be binding upon the District and the Contractor and their respective representatives, successors, and assigns.
- 17. **Controlling Law; Venue.** This Agreement and the provisions contained in this Agreement shall be construed, interpreted, and controlled according to the laws of the State of Florida. Venue shall be in the County in which the District is located.
- 18. Public Records. Contractor understands and agrees that all documents of any kind provided to the District in connection with this Agreement may be public records, and, accordingly, Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable provisions of Florida law in handling such records, including but not limited to Section 119.0701, Florida Statutes. Contractor acknowledges that the designated public records custodian for the District is Craig Wrathell ("Public Records Custodian"). Among other requirements and to the extent applicable by law, the Contractor shall: 1) keep and maintain public records required by the District to perform the service; 2) upon request by the Public Records Custodian, provide the District with the requested public records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time period at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes; 3) ensure that public records which are exempt or confidential, and exempt from public records disclosure requirements, are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the contract term and following the contract term if the Contractor does not transfer the records to the Public Records Custodian of the District; and 4) upon completion of the contract, transfer to the District, at no cost, all public records in the Contractor's possession or, alternatively, keep, maintain and meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records pursuant to Florida laws. When such public records are transferred by the Contractor, the Contractor shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. All records stored electronically must be provided to the District in a format that is compatible with Microsoft Word or Adobe PDF formats.

IF THE CONTRACTOR HAS QUESTIONS REGARDING THE APPLICATION OF CHAPTER 119, FLORIDA STATUTES, TO THE CONTRACTOR'S DUTY TO PROVIDE PUBLIC RECORDS RELATING TO THIS CONTRACT, CONTACT THE CUSTODIAN OF PUBLIC RECORDS AT (561) 571-0010, WRATHELLC@WHHASSOCIATES.COM, OR 2300 GLADES ROAD, SUITE 410W, BOCA RATON, FLORIDA 33431.

- 19. **Severability.** The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this Agreement shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this Agreement, or any part of this Agreement not held to be invalid or unenforceable.
- 20. **Arm's Length Transaction.** This Agreement has been negotiated fully between the District and the Contractor as an arm's length transaction. The District and the Contractor participated

fully in the preparation of this Agreement with the assistance of their respective counsel. In the case of a dispute concerning the interpretation of any provision of this Agreement, the parties are each deemed to have drafted, chosen, and selected the language, and any doubtful language will not be interpreted or construed against any party.

- 21. **E-Verify.** The Contractor shall comply with and perform all applicable provisions of Section 448.095, *Florida Statutes*. Accordingly, to the extent required by Florida Statute, Contractor shall register with and use the United States Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the work authorization status of all newly hired employees. - 22. **Compliance with Section 20.055, Florida Statutes.** The Contractor agrees to comply with Section 20.055(5), *Florida Statutes*, to cooperate with the inspector general in any investigation, audit, inspection, review, or hearing pursuant to such section and to incorporate in all subcontracts the obligation to comply with Section 20.055(5), *Florida Statutes*.
- 23. Statement Regarding Chapter 287 Requirements. Contractor acknowledges that, in addition to all Laws and Regulations that apply to this Agreement, the following provisions of Florida law ("Public Integrity Laws") apply to this Agreement:
 - **A.** Section 287.133, Florida Statutes, titled Public entity crime; denial or revocation of the right to transact business with public entities;
 - **B.** Section 287.134, Florida Statutes, titled Discrimination; denial or revocation of the right to transact business with public entities;
 - **C.** Section 287.135, Florida Statutes, titled Prohibition against contracting with scrutinized companies;
 - **D.** Section 287.137, Florida Statutes, titled Antitrust violations; denial or revocation of the right to transact business with public entities; denial of economic benefits; and
 - **E.** Section 287.138, Florida Statutes, titled Contracting with entities of foreign countries of concern prohibited.

Contractor acknowledges that the Public Integrity Laws prohibit entities that meet certain criteria from bidding on or entering into or renewing a contract with governmental entities, including with the District ("Prohibited Criteria"). Contractor acknowledges that the District may terminate this Agreement if the Contractor is found to have met the Prohibited Criteria or violated the Public Integrity Laws. Contractor certifies that in entering into this Agreement, neither it nor any of its officers, directors, executives, partners, shareholders, employees, members, or agents who are active in the management of the entity, nor any affiliate of the entity, meets any of the Prohibited Criteria, and in the event such status changes, Contractor shall immediately notify the District. By entering into this Agreement, Contractor agrees that any renewal or extension of this Contract shall be deemed a recertification of such status.

If no officer is available, the Agent is authorized to take such action as is needed to avert danger to life, maintain safe operations or prevent an interruption of services.

9. Agent may charge the fee for attendance of any additional District Board meetings beyond 12 District Board meetings held during weekdays/ non - Holiday per fiscal year. Any meeting over 3 hours will be billed at \$100 per hour for the time over the three-hour limit. Lastly, any meeting requiring Agent participation that extends beyond 9pm will be billed at \$100 per hour. For example, if a meeting were to start at 7pm and close at 10pm, the time from 9 - 10pm will be billed at \$100 per hour.

AGREEMENT FOR WETLAND MITIGATION AND MAINTENANCE SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is made and entered into effective as of the 1st day of July 2025, by and between:

Silverlake Community Development District, a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, being situated in the City of Lake Alfred, Polk County, Florida, and whose mailing address is 2300 Glades Road, Suite 410W, Boca Raton, Florida 33431 (the "District"), and

Steadfast Alliance, a Florida limited liability company, with a mailing address of 30435 Commerce Drive, Suite 102, San Antonio, Florida 33576 (the "Contractor").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the District is a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to the Uniform Community Development District Act of 1980, as codified in Chapter 190, Florida Statutes (the "Act"), and located in the City of Lake Alfred, Polk County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the District owns, operates, and maintains certain wetlands; and

WHEREAS, the District desires to enter into an agreement with an independent contractor to provide mitigation and maintenance services for the wetlands; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor provides such services and desires to contract with the District to do so in accordance with the terms and specifications in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the District and Contractor warrant and agree that they have all right, power and authority to enter into and be bound by this Agreement.

Now, THEREFORE, in consideration of the recitals, agreements, and mutual covenants contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the parties, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. INCORPORATION OF RECITALS. The recitals so stated are true and correct and by this reference are incorporated into and form a material part of this Agreement.
- 2. **DESCRIPTION OF WORK AND SERVICES.** Contractor agrees to furnish all necessary labor, materials, equipment, tools, expertise and supplies and perform all tasks necessary for the provision of wetland mitigation and maintenance services, as such services are detailed in **Exhibit A** hereto, by this reference incorporated herein and forming a material part of this Agreement (the "Work"); provided, however, that if there are any conflicts between the terms of **Exhibit A** and the terms of this Agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall control. To the extent additional work is required beyond the Work as defined, supra, such additional

work shall only be authorized pursuant to amendment of this Agreement or shall require additional agreement(s).

- 3. Compensation and Term. In exchange for providing the Work, the District shall pay the Contractor Six Hundred Dollars (\$600) for each maintenance event for a total of Two Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$2,400.00) per year. The Contractor agrees to provide invoices to the District, in writing, which shall describe the portion of the Work provided and the amount of time spent for such portion of the Work, and shall be delivered or mailed to the District by the fifth (5th) day of the next succeeding month after services are rendered pursuant to this Agreement. These invoices are due and payable within thirty (30) days of receipt by the District. Each invoice will include such supporting information as the District may reasonably require the Contractor to provide. The Agreement shall become effective on the date first written above, and shall remain in effect unless terminated with written notice to the other party in accordance with the terms of Section 12 of this Agreement.
- 4. Manner of Contractor's Performance. The Contractor agrees, as an independent contractor, to undertake work and/or perform such services as specified in this Agreement or any addendum executed by the Parties or in any authorized written work order by the District issued in connection with this Agreement and accepted by the Contractor. All work shall be performed in a neat and professional manner reasonably acceptable to the District and shall be in accordance with industry standards. The performance of all services by the Contractor under this Agreement and related to this Agreement shall conform to any written instructions issued by the District.
 - A. Should any work and/or services be required which are not specified in this Agreement or any addenda, but which are nevertheless necessary for the proper provision of services to the District, such work or services shall be fully performed by the Contractor as if described and delineated in this Agreement.
 - **B.** The Contractor agrees that the District shall not be liable for the payment of any work or services unless the District, through an authorized representative of the District, authorizes the Contractor, in writing, to perform such work.
 - C. The District Manager will initially act as the District's representative with respect to the services to be performed under this Agreement. The District's representative shall have complete authority to transmit instructions, receive information, interpret, and define the District's policies and decisions with respect to materials, equipment, elements, and systems pertinent to the Contractor's services.
 - (1) If requested by the District Manager, the Contractor agrees to meet with the District's representative no less than one (1) time per month to inspect the wetlands to discuss conditions, schedules, and items of concern regarding this Agreement.

D. Contractor shall use all due care to protect the property of the District, its residents, and landowners from damage. Contractor agrees to repair any damage resulting from Contractor's activities and work within twenty-four (24) hours.

5. INSURANCE.

- **A.** The Contractor shall maintain throughout the term of this Agreement the following insurance:
 - (1) Worker's Compensation Insurance in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida.
 - (2) Commercial General Liability Insurance covering the Contractor's legal liability for bodily injuries, with limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) combined single limit bodily injury and property damage liability, and covering at least the following hazards:
 - (i) Independent Contractors Coverage for bodily injury and property damage in connection with any subcontractors' operation.
 - (3) Employer's Liability Coverage with limits of at least One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident or disease.
 - (4) Automobile Liability Insurance for bodily injuries in limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) combined single limit bodily injury and for property damage, providing coverage for any accident arising out of or resulting from the operation, maintenance, or use by the Contractor of any owned, non-owned, or hired automobiles, trailers, or other equipment required to be licensed.
- B. The District, its staff, consultants, and supervisors shall be named as an additional insured. The Contractor shall furnish the District with the Certificate of Insurance evidencing compliance with this requirement. No certificate shall be acceptable to the District unless it provides that any change or termination within the policy periods of the insurance coverages, as certified, shall not be effective within thirty (30) days of prior written notice to the District. Insurance coverage shall be from a reputable insurance carrier, licensed to conduct business in the State of Florida, and such carrier shall have a Best's Insurance Reports rating of at least A-VII.
- C. If the Contractor fails to have secured and maintained the required insurance, the District has the right (without any obligation to do so, however), to secure such required insurance in which event, the Contractor shall pay the cost for that required insurance and shall furnish, upon demand, all information that may be required in connection with the District's obtaining the required insurance.

6. INDEMNIFICATION.

- Contractor agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the District and its A. officers, agents, professional staff, successors, assigns, members, affiliates, or representatives from any and all liability, claims, actions, suits, liens, demands, costs, interest, expenses, damages, penalties, fines, judgments against the District, or loss or damage, whether monetary or otherwise, arising out of, wholly or in part by, or in connection with the Services to be performed by Contractor, its subcontractors, its employees and agents in connection with this Agreement, including litigation, mediation, arbitration, appellate, or settlement proceedings with respect thereto. For avoidance of doubt, indemnification obligation of the Contractor herein requires the Contractor to indemnify the District for any and all percentage of fault attributable to Contractor in any claims arising hereunder (whether such claim is against the District, the Contractor or the District and Contractor as jointly liable parties) regardless of whether the District is adjudged to be more or less than 50% at fault. Contractor further agrees that nothing herein shall constitute or be construed as a waiver of the District's limitations on liability contained in section 768.28, Florida Statutes, or other statute.
- **B.** Obligations under this section shall include the payment of all settlements, judgments, damages, liquidated damages, penalties, forfeitures, back pay awards, court costs, arbitration and/or mediation costs, litigation expenses, attorneys' fees, paralegal fees, expert witness fees (incurred in court, out of court, on appeal, or in bankruptcy proceedings), any interest, expenses, damages, penalties, fines, or judgments against the District.
- 7. COMPLIANCE WITH GOVERNMENTAL REGULATION. The Contractor shall keep, observe, and perform all requirements of applicable local, State, and Federal laws, rules, regulations, or ordinances. If the Contractor fails to notify the District in writing within five (5) days of the receipt of any notice, order, required to comply notice, or a report of a violation or an alleged violation, made by any local, State, or Federal governmental body or agency or subdivision thereof with respect to the services being rendered under this Agreement or any action of the Contractor or any of its agents, servants, employees, or materialmen, or with respect to terms, wages, hours, conditions of employment, safety appliances, or any other requirements applicable to provision of services, or fails to comply with any requirement of such agency within five (5) days after receipt of any such notice, order, request to comply notice, or report of a violation or an alleged violation, the District may terminate this Agreement, such termination to be effective upon the giving of notice of termination.
- **8. LIENS AND CLAIMS.** The Contractor shall promptly and properly pay for all labor employed, materials purchased, and equipment hired by it to perform under this Agreement. The Contractor shall keep the District's property free from any materialmen's or mechanic's liens and claims or notices in respect to such liens and claims, which arise by reason of the Contractor's performance under this Agreement, and the Contractor shall immediately discharge any such claim or lien. In the event that the Contractor does not pay or satisfy such claim or lien within three (3) business days after the filing of notice thereof, the District, in addition to any and

all other remedies available under this Agreement, may terminate this Agreement to be effective immediately upon the giving notice of termination.

- 9. **DEFAULT AND PROTECTION AGAINST THIRD PARTY INTERFERENCE.** A default by either Party under this Agreement shall entitle the other to all remedies available at law or in equity, which may include, but not be limited to, the right of damages, injunctive relief, and/or specific performance. The District shall be solely responsible for enforcing its rights under this Agreement against any interfering third party. Nothing contained herein shall limit or impair the District's right to protect its rights from interference by a third party to this Agreement.
- 10. CUSTOM AND USAGE. It is hereby agreed, any law, custom, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding, that the District shall have the right at all times to enforce the conditions and agreements contained in this Agreement in strict accordance with the terms of this Agreement, notwithstanding any conduct or custom on the part of the District in refraining from so doing; and further, that the failure of the District at any time or times to strictly enforce its rights under this Agreement shall not be construed as having created a custom in any way or manner contrary to the specific conditions and agreements of this Agreement, or as having in any way modified or waived the same.
- 11. Successors. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns of the Parties to this Agreement, except as expressly limited in this Agreement.
- 12. TERMINATION. The District agrees that the Contractor may terminate this Agreement with or without cause by providing sixty (60) days written notice of termination to the District; provided, however, that the District shall be provided a reasonable opportunity to cure any failure under this Agreement. The Contractor agrees that the District may terminate this Agreement immediately for cause by providing written notice of termination to the Contractor. The District shall provide thirty (30) days written notice of termination without cause. Upon any termination of this Agreement, the Contractor shall be entitled to payment for all work and/or services rendered up until the effective termination of this Agreement, subject to whatever claims or off-sets the District may have against the Contractor.
- 13. PERMITS AND LICENSES. All permits and licenses required by any governmental agency directly for the District shall be obtained and paid for by the District. All other permits or licenses necessary for the contractor to perform under this Agreement shall be obtained and paid for by the Contractor.
- 14. ASSIGNMENT. Neither party may assign this Agreement without prior written approval of the other. Any purported assignment without such approval shall be void.

The Contractor shall not have any authority to assume or create any obligation, express or implied, on behalf of the District and the Contractor shall have no authority to represent the District as an agent, employee, or in any other capacity, unless otherwise set forth in this Agreement.

- 16. HEADINGS FOR CONVENIENCE ONLY. The descriptive headings in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall neither control nor affect the meaning or construction of any of the provisions of this Agreement.
- 17. ENFORCEMENT OF AGREEMENT. In the event that either the District or the Contractor is required to enforce this Agreement by court proceedings or otherwise, then the substantially prevailing party shall be entitled to recover all fees and costs incurred, including reasonable attorneys' fees, paralegal fees and expert witness fees and costs for trial, alternative dispute resolution, or appellate proceedings.
- 18. AGREEMENT. This instrument shall constitute the final and complete expression of this Agreement between the District and the Contractor relating to the subject matter of this Agreement. All prior agreements regarding the matters provided herein are hereby superseded and replaced by this Agreement.
- 19. AMENDMENTS. Amendments to and waivers of the provisions contained in this Agreement may be made only by an instrument in writing which is executed by both the District and the Contractor.
- **20. AUTHORIZATION.** The execution of this Agreement has been duly authorized by the appropriate body or official of the District and the Contractor, both the District and the Contractor have complied with all the requirements of law, and both the District and the Contractor have full power and authority to comply with the terms and provisions of this instrument.
- 21. NOTICES. All notices, requests, consents, and other communications under this Agreement ("Notices") shall be in writing and shall be delivered, mailed by First Class Mail, postage prepaid, or overnight delivery service, to the parties, as follows:

Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays recognized by the United States government shall not be regarded as business days. Counsel for the District and counsel for the Contractor may deliver Notice on behalf of the District and the Contractor. Any party or other person to whom Notices are to be sent or copied may notify the other parties and addressees of any change in name or address to which Notices shall be sent by providing the same on five (5) days' written notice to the parties and addressees set forth herein.

- 22. THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARIES. This Agreement is solely for the benefit of the District and the Contractor and no right or cause of action shall accrue upon or by reason, to or for the benefit of any third party not a formal party to this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement expressed or implied is intended or shall be construed to confer upon any person or corporation other than the District and the Contractor any right, remedy, or claim under or by reason of this Agreement or any of the provisions or conditions of this Agreement; and all of the provisions, representations, covenants, and conditions contained in this Agreement shall inure to the sole benefit of and shall be binding upon the District and the Contractor and their respective representatives, successors, and assigns.

IF THE CONTRACTOR HAS QUESTIONS REGARDING THE APPLICATION OF CHAPTER 119, FLORIDA STATUTES, TO THE CONTRACTOR'S DUTY TO PROVIDE PUBLIC RECORDS RELATING TO THIS CONTRACT, CONTACT THE CUSTODIAN OF PUBLIC RECORDS AT (561) 571-0010, SUITK@WHHASSOCIATES.COM, 2300 GLADES ROAD, SUITE 410W, BOCA RATON, FLORIDA 33431.

- 25. SEVERABILITY. The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this Agreement shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this Agreement, or any part of this Agreement not held to be invalid or unenforceable.
- **26. ARM'S LENGTH TRANSACTION.** This Agreement has been negotiated fully between the District and the Contractor as an arm's length transaction. The District and the Contractor participated fully in the preparation of this Agreement with the assistance of their respective counsel. In the case of a dispute concerning the interpretation of any provision of this Agreement, the parties are each deemed to have drafted, chosen, and selected the language, and any doubtful language will not be interpreted or construed against any party.
- **27. COUNTERPARTS.** This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which when executed and delivered shall be an original; however, all such counterparts together shall constitute, but one and the same instrument.
- **28. E-VERIFY REQUIREMENTS.** The Contractor shall comply with and perform all applicable provisions of Section 448.095, *Florida Statutes*. Accordingly, to the extent required by Florida Statute, Contractor shall register with and use the United States Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the work authorization status of all newly hired employees. The District may terminate this Agreement immediately for cause if there is a good faith belief that the Contractor has knowingly violated Section 448.091, *Florida Statutes*.

If the Contractor anticipates entering into agreements with a subcontractor for the Work, Contractor will not enter into the subcontractor agreement without first receiving an affidavit from the subcontractor regarding compliance with Section 448.095, *Florida Statutes*, and stating that the subcontractor does not employ, contract with, or subcontract with an unauthorized alien. Contractor shall maintain a copy of such affidavit for the duration of the agreement and provide a copy to the District upon request.

In the event that the District has a good faith belief that a subcontractor has knowingly violated Section 448.095, *Florida Statutes*, but the Contractor has otherwise complied with its

obligations hereunder, the District shall promptly notify the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to immediately terminate the agreement with the subcontractor upon notice from the District. Further, absent such notification from the District, the Contractor or any subcontractor who has a good faith belief that a person or entity with which it is contracting has knowingly violated s. 448.09(1), *Florida Statutes*, shall promptly terminate its agreement with such person or entity.

By entering into this Agreement, the Contractor represents that no public employer has terminated a contract with the Contractor under Section 448.095(2)(c), *Florida Statutes*, within the year immediately preceding the date of this Agreement.

- **29. COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 20.055,** *FLORIDA STATUTES.* The Contractor agrees to comply with Section 20.055(5), *Florida Statutes*, to cooperate with the inspector general in any investigation, audit, inspection, review, or hearing pursuant such section and to incorporate in all subcontracts the obligation to comply with Section 20.055(5), *Florida Statutes*.
- **30. STATEMENT REGARDING CHAPTER 287 REQUIREMENTS.** Contractor acknowledges that, in addition to all Laws and Regulations that apply to this Agreement, the following provisions of Florida law ("Public Integrity Laws") apply to this Agreement:
- A. Section 287.133, Florida Statutes, titled Public entity crime; denial or revocation of the right to transact business with public entities;
- B. Section 287.134, Florida Statutes, titled Discrimination; denial or revocation of the right to transact business with public entities;
- C. Section 287.135, Florida Statutes, titled Prohibition against contracting with scrutinized companies;
- D. Section 287.137, Florida Statutes, titled Antitrust violations; denial or revocation of the right to transact business with public entities; denial of economic benefits; and
- E. Section 287.138, Florida Statutes, titled Contracting with entities of foreign countries of concern prohibited.

Contractor acknowledges that the Public Integrity Laws prohibit entities that meet certain criteria from bidding on or entering into or renewing a contract with governmental entities, including with the District ("Prohibited Criteria"). Contractor acknowledges that the District may terminate this Agreement if the Contractor is found to have met the Prohibited Criteria or violated the Public Integrity Laws. Contractor certifies that in entering into this Agreement, neither it nor any of its officers, directors, executives, partners, shareholders, employees, members, or agents who are active in the management of the entity, nor any affiliate of the entity, meets any of the Prohibited Criteria, and in the event such status changes, Contractor shall immediately notify the District. By entering into this Agreement, Contractor agrees that any renewal or extension of this Contract shall be deemed a recertification of such status.

Ms. Suit presented the Perpetual Access and Maintenance Easement Agreement for Silverlake Phase 2 Lakes and Stormwater Drainage Facilities, Water Management Berms, Irrigation and Landscape Improvements.

Mr. Dugan stated the Agreement stipulates that the CDD is responsible for maintaining certain landscape improvements located outside the CDD boundaries on property owned by the Rohlfing Groves Company.
